DIRECTIONS

1.) Leave the T. Spencer Knight Canal
Park and head south over Veterans
Memorial Bridge. This is East Ave. As
you walk the four blocks to Grant
St., you will see some turn of the
century homes, built by prominent
Newark residents.

2.) When you reach Grant St., turn right and view some additional turn of the century homes on a beautiful tree-lined residential street.

3.) When you reach South Main St., turn right for a stroll down our mam thoroughfare past four of Newark's Churches (St. Mark's Episcopal, St. Michael's Catholic, First Methodist and Park




Presbyterian), the Post Office and Central Park, with a bandstand and the Veteran's Memorial. **4.)** Continue up South Main St. passed stores and restaurants.

Main Street Bridge that crosses the canal, you will be back at the Canal Park.

(A 1 MILE WALK)


ALTERNATIVE ROUTE

3a.) As Grant St. meets South Main St., turn left onto South Main St. and walk south to the stop light at corner of South Main and West Maple Ave. Turn right at light and walk west on West Maple Avenue. This route will take you by more historic homes and one of our two K-2 Elementary Schools (Perkins School).



3b.) At the intersection of West Ave. and West Maple Ave., turn right and walk three blocks to West Miller St., viewing some older homes as well as some homes built in the 1950's and 1960's. Turn right again onto West Miller St. and walk by Kelley School (grades 3-5). Just two more blocks until a turn to the left onto South Main St. will bring you back to the Canal Park.
